✤ Homily then Creed:

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

WORD of God – are we Listening better ? → Use these notes to pray through <u>Lectio Divina</u> on the text of this Sunday's Gospel:

**Lectio**: We begin the readings for the Lenten Season. They are chosen to accompany our journey of renewal through Lent until we renew our commitment to our faith at Easter. So we start with the temptations of the Lord to remind us of the continuing temptations we face as followers of Jesus.

#### Read: Matthew 4: 1-11

**Meditatio:** Have there been times when I have been more vulnerable to temptation; e.g. through stress or weariness? Stones into bread – do I sometimes ask for things that are not possible? How important is the word of God for me? Do I do things that are too risky? Do I take due care of my health and my life? Do I let money, possessions or power rule my life? How do I deal with temptations?

**Oratio:** Pray for faith and wisdom to recognise temptations and the dangers in them. Pray for extra resolve to be true to Jesus and not to be caught out in times of stress etc. Pray for the proper use of money and power. Pray that Lent will be a time of critical reflection and renewal of our lives.

**Contemplatio** – Dwell in stillness, simply aware of the boundless expanse of mercy that surrounds you.

**After your prayer** – Give to Project Compassion; put its box in a prominent place in your home.
