

#### ✤ Homily then Creed:

All: I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, he was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he shall come to judge the living and the dead. #### WORD of God - are we Listening better ?

→Use these notes to pray through <u>Lectio Divina</u> on the text of this Sunday's Gospel:

**Lectio**: Our text in Matthew's Gospel is the first major teaching of Jesus that Matthew records. Jesus' teachings guide us in response to his first words: *"Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand"* (Mt 4:17) i.e. the Good News. Jesus had called his first disciples and they left everything to follow him. In events, not recorded, he had taught and proclaimed the Good News and cured many of the crowds that were gathering and following him. It is time to put before the crowds his new thinking so they can re-think (i.e. repent) their lives and become truly his followers.

Read Matthew 5: 2 – 12 (The Beatitudes)

**Meditatio:** How closely do my ways follow Jesus' ways? What sort of an example am I to my neighbours? Am I "poor in spirit"; do I know I depend on God's blessings? Do I have a gentle care for others and for our environment? How far do I go in the cause of what is right? Am I merciful, pure of heart, a peacemaker? Or do I see these as weaknesses? Am I taking up my crosses trusting my reward will be great in heaven?

**Oratio:** Pray that the Beatitudes will shape our lives. Pray that the Beatitudes will help us to understand the way of the Cross. Pray for those persecuted in the cause of right. Pray that Australians will support each other especially those in need or adversity. Pray for a warm welcome and a happy life for people who take on Australian citizenship. Pray for a gentle and merciful care of those recovering after the bushfires.

**Contemplatio** – Dwell in stillness, simply aware of the boundless expanse of mercy that surrounds you.

**After your prayer** – Take time to reflect: How well does my thinking reflect Jesus' thinking. *E* **F Joe**
