✤ Homily then Creed:

All: I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, he was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he shall come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen

WORD of God – are we Listening better?

→Use these notes to pray through <u>Lectio Divina</u> on the text of the Midnight & Dawn Masses Gospels:

Lectio: The first chapter of Luke's Gospel has set the scene for Christ's birth – the foretelling of John the Baptist's birth, the Annunciation, the Visitation and the birth of John the Baptist. Nine months have passed since the Holy Spirit overshadowed Mary as she consented to be the Mother of God and Jesus was conceived at the Annunciation. Luke now recounts the timing and the events surrounding Jesus' birth.

Read **Luke 2: 1 - 20**

Meditatio: What town or community do I belong to; what are my origins? How important is family to me? How have I celebrated the birth of a child? When and where have I seen the glory of God? What is important to me about Jesus' birth? What would have been my reaction to finding the new born Jesus in a manger with Mary and Joseph? What family moments do I treasure in my heart? How do I give glory and praise to God?

Oratio: Pray for families at Christmas. Pray that children may have parents who love them. Pray that the joy of Christmas may be shared by everyone. Pray that Jesus' birth may be a sign of hope to the world. Pray that we will give praise and glory to God every day, not just at Christmas.

Contemplatio – Dwell in stillness, simply aware of the boundless expanse of mercy that surrounds you.

After your prayer – Spend time with your family and share and listen to everyone's story. *K* Fr Joe
