WORD of God – are we Listening better ? → Use these notes to pray through Lectio Divina on the text of this Sunday's Gospel:

**Lectio**: Our text continues the first teaching of Jesus in Matthew's Gospel – *the Sermon on the Mount* Jesus began with the Beatitudes as the pattern for his disciples then the 2 proverbs, describing a disciples' mission as salt of the earth and light of the world. Now Jesus teaches his disciples that they are called to go further than the minimums set by the Law.

#### Read: Matthew 5: 17 - 37 Or shorter form: Mt 5:20-22, 27-28, 33-34, 37

**Meditatio:** Do I live my faith just to fulfil my obligations or do I go further than that? Do I see how the laws are the base on which I then build my life as a Christian? When I repent, after doing wrong, do I go further, in a timely way, to repair the damage I have done to myself and to others? Have hurts led to resentments and a deadness within me? Do I tolerate some things that are false or evil? What am I obsessed by? Do these obsessions help me be a better Christian or do they need to be cut out? Am I clear and truthful in all I say?

**Oratio:** Pray for a faith that is strong and not lukewarm. Pray for healing for all who have been hurt in any way. Pray for those who harbour ill-will to others. Pray for faithfulness in marriage. Pray for judges and all working in our legal system. Pray truth will eliminate the need to swear.

**Contemplatio** – Dwell in stillness, simply aware of the boundless expanse of mercy that surrounds you.

**After your prayer** – Find ways to go a bit further in caring for others.
