Corona Virus Crisis:

> PUBLIC liturgies, including celebrations of the Mass, are suspended until further notice.

NOTE: The Sunday Obligation of the Faithful will not apply during this time of suspension.

• Masses Privately etc: Fr Joe will continue to say Masses privately through this time of suspension of Public Masses. Private Home Masses are no longer allowed. Mass Online is available for people to join together in spiritual communion. Details are available at cam.org.au Communion to the sick and homebound is no longer allowed. A priest only can take Communion to a dying person, i.e. administer Viaticum

• **Reconciliation & Anointing:** These Sacraments are available on a one to one basis. Contact Fr Joe to arrange a time and place if you require these Sacraments. In an Emergency Fr Joe may be contacted **as above on a** (03) **9401 6314** or **a** (03) **9401 6313**

● **Baptisms, Weddings & Funerals:** Baptisms are to be postponed unless there is an urgent and grave pastoral need. Weddings are to be postponed where possible. If baptisms or weddings meet these criteria only 5 persons may gather. Funerals can be celebrated if urgent with 10 or less persons. In all circumstances appropriate health guidelines are to be adhered to. *A*chbishop Peter Comensoli

<u>WORD of God</u> – are we Listening better ? →Use these notes to pray through <u>Lectio Divina</u>

on the text of this Sunday's Gospel:

Lectio: Jesus has done the impossible, giving sight to the man born blind (Jn9). He then claimed "I am the Good Shepherd" (Jn 10:14); then said it openly "I and the Father are one" (Jn 11:30). The Jews (i.e. the religious leaders) saw his statements as blasphemy and wanted to stone him. But many people came to believe in him. Jesus shows that his claims are true by doing what God alone can do – raising the dead. This act will convince many of the Jews. But the Pharisees, in fear of the Roman occupier's response, plot for Jesus' death (Jn 11:45-53).

Read: John 11: 1 – 45 or Shorter version:

The sisters, Mary and Martha, sent this message to Jesus, 'Lord, the man you love is ill.' On receiving the message, Jesus said, 'This sickness will end not in death but in God's glory, and through it the Son of God will be glorified.'

Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus, yet when he heard that Lazarus was ill, he stayed where he was for two more days before saying to the disciples, Let us go to Judea (where the Jews had wanted to stone him).

On arriving, Jesus found that Lazarus had been in the tomb for four days already. Bethany is only about two miles from Jerusalem, and many Jews had come to Martha and Mary to sympathasise with them over their brother. When Martha heard that Jesus had come she went to meet him. Mary remained sitting in the house. Martha said to Jesus, 'If you had been here, my brother would not have died, but I know that, even now, whatever you ask God, he will grant you.' Your brother' said Jesus to her 'will rise again.' Martha said, 'I know he will rise again at the resurrection on the last day.' Jesus said: 'I am the resurrection and the life, if anyone believes in me, even though he dies he will live, and whoever lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this? 'Yes Lord, she said 'I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who was to come into this world.'

Jesus said in a great distress, with a sigh that came straight from the heart, 'Where have you put him?' They said, 'Lord, come and see.' Jesus wept; and the Jews said, 'See how much he loved him !' But there were some who remarked, 'He opened the eves of the blind man, could he not have prevented this man's death?' Still sighing, Jesus reached the tomb: it was a cave with a stone to close the opening. Jesus said, 'Take the stone away.' Martha said to him 'Lord by now he will smell; this is the fourth day.' Jesus replied Have I not told you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?' So they took away the stone. Then Jesus lifted his eyes and said: 'Father, in thank you for hearing my prayer. I knew indeed that you always hear me, but I speak for the sake of all these who stand around me, so that they may believe it was you who sent me.' When he had said this, he cried in a loud voice, 'Lazarus here ! Come out !' The dead man came out, his feet and hands bound with bands of stuff and a

Meditatio: How am I coping with the threat of illness? Have I confidence that the Lord will bring me through this COVID-19 crisis; however long it takes? Do I emphathise with the ill, those caring for them, with authorities trying to help, and with those who have lost loved ones? Is my faith in Jesus as 'the Resurrection and the life', still strong? How am I caring for my loved ones, as well as, the elderly and those under financial stress? How is my belief in Jesus; am I 'standing round him'? From what do I need to be 'set free'?

Oratio: Pray for peace and a deepening belief that the Lord is standing by us. Pray for the hope in the Resurrection. Pray for families under financial stress. Pray for those who have lost and/or will lose jobs. Pray that those in need will get the help that is on offer. Pray that fear will **not** bind us up. Pray for a renewal of prayer life. Pray for a renewal of faith. Pray that the Holy Spirit will renew our Church and our faith through the Plenary Council.

Contemplatio – Dwell in stillness, simply aware of the boundless expanse of mercy that surrounds you.

After your prayer – Be an agent of peace and of neighbourly care. *K* Fr Joe
