WORD of God – are we Listening better?

→ Use these notes to pray through <u>Lectio Divina</u> on the text of this Sunday's Gospel:

Lectio: This weekend we are celebrating the the reality of God's presence with us in the **Eucharist**. In the Gospel of John the understanding of Jesus as the **Living Bread** is developed at length, especially in Ch 6. This is probably coming from the **early Church's experience** of celebrating the Eucharist. This is consistent with John's Gospel being written in about 66AD but not finally edited, to the text we have today, until about 110AD.

Our text comes after the **feeding of the Five Thousand** – from 5 loaves and 2 fish. This reminds us of the marvellous transformation that occurs in the Eucharist by the power of the Holy Spirit – bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ. After this event Jesus goes to the hills **by himself**. Jesus comes back to the disciples **walking on the water** while they are struggling to make headway in a storm. The storm is calmed and they reach the shore. The people seek out Jesus and, when they find him (seeking more miracles), he sets about **explaining what they had experienced**. Our text concludes this explanation with Jesus teaching the Jews in the stnagogue at Capernaum.

Jesus said to the Jews: 'I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world.' Then the Jews started arguing with one another: 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' they said.

Jesus replied: I tell you most solemnly, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you will not have life in you. Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life, and I shall raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I live in him. As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father, so whoever eats me will draw life from me. This is the bread come down from heaven; not like the bread our ancestors ate: they are dead, but anyone who eats this bread will live for ever.

Meditatio: What understanding do I have of the Mass, of the Eucharist? Am I overwhelmed by the miracle of the Eucharist? Do I appreciate the gift of God's love for me

given in the Eucharist? Do I seek miracles rather than trusting in the Lord's care and concern for me? Holy Communion is real food, what does this mean to me? When receiving Communion I say 'Amen', is it my act of faith in the real presence of Christ? How vital/life-giving/eternal-life-giving is the Eucharist for me? Jesus is alive within me — how wonderful!? Is Jesus' life within me growing, nourished by the Eucharist? Bread from heaven, bread of angels, how privileged I am to share this bread!?

Oratio: Pray for a love and understanding of the Eucharist/Mass. Pray for an active participation of all who gather for the Eucharist. Pray for those who can only make spiritual communions. Pray that participation in the Mass will be renewed after Covid-19. Pray for a better understanding of Christ's real presence in the Eucharist. Pray for those who have lost the practice of their faith. Pray for a renewed hope in the promise of eternal life that flows from the Eucharist.

Contemplatio – Dwell in stillness, simply aware of the boundless expanse of mercy that surrounds you.

After your prayer — Make your 'Amen' at receiving Holy Communion a true Act of Faith.




