





#### $\underline{WORD of God}$ – are we Listening better?

→ Use these notes to pray through <u>Lectio Divina</u> on the text of this Sunday's Gospel:

**Lectio**: Our text is the whole of chapter nine. Jesus is in the midst of discussions with the Jews who have set themselves to reject Jesus. Threatened with being stoned, Jesus had just come out of hiding from the Jews. One of the Jews' understandings was that sin was the cause of illness or disability. Jesus will contest this understanding.

Read: **John 9: 1 - 42** or Shorter version:

As Jesus went along, he saw a man who had been blind from birth. He spat on the ground, made a paste with the spittle, put this over the eyes of the blind man and said to him, 'Go and wash in the Pool of Siloam' (a name that means 'sent'). So the blind man went off and washed himself, and came away with his sight restored.

His neighbours and people who earlier had seen him begging said, 'Isn't this the man who used to sit and beg?' Some said, 'Yes, it is the same one.' Others said, 'No, he only looks like him.' The man himself said, 'I am the man.'

They brought the man who had been blind to the Pharisees. It had been a Sabbath day when Jesus made the paste and opened the man's eyes, so when the Pharisees asked him how he had come to see, he said, 'He put a paste on my eyes, and I washed, and I can see.' Then some Pharisees said, 'This man cannot be from God: he does not keep the Sabbath. 'Others said, 'How could a sinner produce signs like this?' And there was disagreement among them. So they spoke to the blind man again, 'What have you to say about him yourself, now that he has opened your eyes?" He is a prophet replied the man.

'Are you trying to teach us,; the Pharisees replied 'and you a sinner through and through, since you were born!' And they drove him away.

Jesus heard they had driven him away, and when he found him he said to him, 'Do you believe in the Son of Man?' Sir,' the man replied 'tell me who he is so that I may believe in him.' Jesus said, 'You are looking at him; he is speaking to you.' The man said, 'Lord, I believe', and worshipped him.

Meditatio: Do I understand that sinning can mess up mine and others' lives? How do I cope when illness or bad things happen in my life? How has Jesus been a light for me through my troubles? Have other people ever persuaded me to not speak the truth? How have I responded to threats? Have I been slow to accept God's blessings & guidance in my life; have I been blind to them? How is my relationship with Jesus; can I say with conviction: "Lord, I believe"?

**Oratio:** Pray for deeper faith in Jesus. Pray for blind people and anyone living with a disability. Pray for an understanding of the dangers of sinning. Pray for consideration of how our actions affect others. Pray for calm in this time of pandemic. Pray that truth may not be overwhelmed by fear or threat. Pray that the light of Christ may lead us always.

**Contemplatio** – Dwell in stillness, simply aware of the boundless expanse of mercy that surrounds you.

**After your prayer** — Respect the dignity of everyone who is disabled; never treat them as inferior.  $\angle Fr$  Joe
