✤ Homily then Creed:

All: I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. WORD of God – are we Listening better ?

→Use these notes to pray through <u>Lectio Divina</u> on the text of this Sunday's Gospel:

Lectio: Our text comes after Matthew has told the stories of Jesus' origin, his birth and up to several years later when his family settled in Nazareth. The Romans controlled the country. John, as a prophet, foresaw the fall of Jerusalem. Jesus the '*nezer*' (shoot) was their only hope. A change of heart (repentance) was needed. Neither the ways of power of the priestly Sadduces nor the excessive piety of the lay Pharisees would work. (Note the play on words: Iin Hebrewl 'children' is '*banim*' while 'stones is '*abanim*'.)

Read Matthew 3: 1 - 12

Meditatio: Of what do I need to repent? Is there room in my life for Jesus; for his ways? Am I set in MY ways? What is my image of a true prophet? How is my life changed by my baptism? Do I think I have a privileged position over non-christians? What 'good fruit' do I produce? Is my life 'wheat' or 'chaff'?

Oratio: Pray for a genuine change of heart – to follow the Lord. Pray that the call to repentance will be heard and people will turn to the Lord and confess their sins. Pray that we will not ignore the Lord who sometimes cries out to us through the poor. Pray that power and influence may not be misused. Pray that our piety will not overwhelm our primary option for the poor. Pray for an openness to the transforming power of the Holy Spirit.

Contemplatio – Dwell in stillness, simply aware of the boundless expanse of mercy that surrounds you.

After your prayer – Examine your conscience – what do I need to repent of (re-think) in my life. *ZFr Joe*
